Do This in Memory - First meeting for parents of children who will receive the sacraments of Reconciliation and First Holy Communion this year will take place in the school on Thursday 10th October at 7:30pm. Notes were distributed last week. Do This in Memory Enrolment Mass will take place on Sunday 20th October in Holy Cross Church at 11:30am.

School Mass - Thanks to Canon Jimmy for celebrating our school Mass. It was a very nice school, parish and community event which brought pupils, staff, parents and extended family together. It was great to see so many in attendance. Thanks to the children for their participation and to the choir who sang so beautifully.

Eco-Council – Congratulations to the members of the Eco-Council who will have a busy year ahead. They have been hard at work already as they were in attendance at weekend Masses saying prayers, reflections and handing out leaflets.

Picking up - Parents / guardians picking up children at 2pm and 3pm are reminded that parking is prohibited in the bus lane. Cars must not park on the kerb as buses are trying to get through and children are moving across the car park. This constitutes a health and safety issue.

Smoke free zone - The school buildings, grounds and areas around the main gates are a smoke free zone. Parents / guardians and visitors must not smoke in the grounds. As a school we promote healthy living and as such, adults seen smoking in the grounds does not support our policy. Anyone seen smoking will be asked to stop and remove smoking litter from the premises.

Lisnaskea Feis - A reminder that forms and money to enter the Feis should be handed in by Friday 4th October. We ask for as many pupils to take part as possible as this is a local Feis and there has been a huge amount of effort by the organising committee.

We ask that you be considerate in not wearing a mask as this can be unsettling for Nursery, P1 and P2 pupils.

Technology - We have purchased 5 new Smartboards for classrooms. The older whiteboards have been giving problems and needing essential maintenance. We hope that the new technology will give children an even better learning experience.

Nut allergy - <u>A reminder that nuts or nut based products are not allowed in school or for lunch.</u>

There are children who have a nut allergy and must not come into contact with these products.

Dinner - The cost of dinner is £2.60 per day or £13 for a week. Anyone who is entitled to free school meals should contact Christina in the Office to receive a form as soon as possible. The number of children taking free school meals has a positive impact on our school budget.

Respecting school property - There have been a few incidents of vandalism in the boy's toilets upstairs. The result has been flooding of the toilet areas and putting them out of action.
