


St. Ronan's Primary and Nursery School January 2020 Newsletter

Inspection – The school had an inspection on Safeguarding and Child Protection by the Education and Training Inspectorate (ETI) on Monday 13th January.

Extra learning – Mr Shannon will be providing extra literacy and numeracy lessons for P6 pupils on Tuesday and Thursday mornings (8:30am – 9:15am) beginning Tuesday 28th January. Further details to follow.

Breakfast Club – will be provided for pupils P1 – P4 initially on a daily basis beginning Monday 20^{th} January 8:30 – 8:55am. Cost is 50p per child per day. This is not being provided to P5 – P7 pupils currently as they have access to the canteen at break time. Toast <u>or</u> pancake <u>or</u> muffin <u>or</u> croissant <u>and</u> a drink (Juice, water, milk).

Homework Club – We are thinking of starting a Homework Club in the near future. It will run from Monday to Thursday (3-5pm) and Friday (3-4pm). The cost will be £2 per child per day Monday to Thursday and £1 per child on Friday. A light snack will also be provided. If you are interested in your child attending, please let Christina know asap. If there are sufficient numbers we will send out further details.

Music – P5 clarinet tuition continues every Monday with Neil Guy from the EA Music Service. Pupils are reminded to bring their clarinet to school. The school has met the considerable cost of tuition and expects pupils to bring their clarinet. If forgotten, parents will be expected to drop it off at the school in time for lessons.

P3 and P4 are participating in Musical Pathways every Tuesday afternoon. Again, the school has met the cost of these lessons.

Folk Tales of Fermanagh – Carlo Gebler will read a number of folk tales to P7 pupils on Thursday 16th January.

Fundamental Skills – will begin on Wednesday 29^{th} January (3 - 4pm) for P3 pupils and Thursday 30^{th} (3 - 4pm) for P5 pupils. The club will run for 10 weeks and cost £25. Further details will be issued to pupils. Tutor is Sammy Owens.
