


St. Ronan's Primary and Nursery School February 2020 Newsletter

Pledge – P7 pupils who choose to take the Pledge can do so at Mass on Sunday 1st March at 11:30am in Holy Cross Church.

First Penance – P4 pupils will celebrate First Penance on Thursday 26th March at 7pm in Holy Cross Church, Lisnaskea.
